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NOMINATION MEETING  
FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 10, 2006

The following were present:

Mr. McCoy: The time is 3:00 P.M. its February 10, 2006. The purpose of recording these minutes is for the nomination meeting to be held in accordance with the election of two delegates and two alternate delegates to the IBT convention. The local will now conduct the nomination for delegates and alternate delegates to the International convention in June. Delegate nomination and elections are being conducted pursuant to the rules for the 2005 2006 IBT International delegate and officers election. Copy of the rules are here at this office if anyone wishes to review them. The number of delegates this local is entitled to send to this convention is two. The number of alternate delegates this local is entitled to send is two. The local will not pay the expenses of the two alternate delegate to attend this convention. Any member in good standing with dues paid through January, 2006 may nominate or second the nomination. Any member may nominate more than one candidate. A member may be nominated by more than one person to guard against the nominator proving to be ineligible. Nominations and seconds can be made in writing, received by 5:00 P.M. the business day before the meeting and will be read at the beginning at the floor nominations. If none are received, so state. Acceptances can be in writing, received not later than the time of the members nomination today. Know one may be a candidate for both delegate or alternate delegate. To be a candidate, one must be a member in continuous good standing of this local union for 24 months with dues paid through January, 2006. When you rise to nominate, second or accept, please state your name, spell your last name and give your social security number. The order of candidates names on the ballot will be determined by a lot after the meeting, not by the order of nomination. Nominees should remain after the close of nominations for a candidates meeting. Slates may be formed by filling out a slate declaration form within three days of this meeting. The chair has slate declaration forms. Slate forms must be filed with the Secretary/Treasurer, with a copy sent to the Election Supervisor. If a member has a dispute concerning the conduct of this meeting, or the eligibility

of any nominator, seconder or candidate, he or she must file a written protest with the Election Supervisor within two days of this meeting. After explaining the above process, the chair should open nomination by reading any written nominations before floor nominations are taken. Ask after each nomination, ask for a second, and ask if a candidate accepts. Ask for nominations until it is clear that no more are forthcoming. Ask three times with no response before closing nominations. After closing nominations for delegate, open nominations for alternate delegate, starting with written nominations. The chair should allow all nominations, seconds and acceptances, even if there is a question as to eligibility. Unlike officers elections, the Secretary/Treasurer is responsible for determining the eligibility of candidates, nominators and seconds. The only way to challenge the eligibility of candidates, nominators and seconds is to file an eligibility protest with the Election Supervisor, within two working days of the nomination meeting. At the close of nominations, if it is a white ballot, the chair should inform the membership that the nominees are deemed elected. If the number of nominees exceeds the number in which the local is entitled, the chair should inform the members of the dates of the mailing and tally of ballots and introduce the election committee if there is one. Remind candidates to remain after the meeting adjourns for the lottery to determine either ballot placement or in the case of a white ballot ranking of delegates and alternates.

T. R. McCoy: At this time we will ask the Secretary of the Federation if we have received any nominations, seconds and acceptances.

Secretary: Yes we have. J. E. David, has 8 nominations, the first one is from E. A. Perkins, seconds name is Clyde Moore and its been accepted. The second one is Brad Dawson, the seconds name is Ronald Jacob and it has been accepted. The next one is Gordon Burkland, the seconds name is Tom Grochala, and its been accepted. The next one is Clinton Lovett, the seconder is Robert Pruitt and its been accepted. Robert Standley, the seconds name is Thomas Lager and its been accepted. The next one is Billy Lewis, the seconds name is Jimmy Davidson and its been accepted. Alvin R. Young, the seconds name is J. M. Newman, and its been accepted. The last one for J. E. David is R. L. Procise and its been accepted.

Secretary: We have another candidate for nomination is R. L. Procise

Mr. McCoy: What position?

Secretary: For Delegate.

Mr. McCoy: Was the first position for J. E. David, was that a delegate also?

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Secretary: Yes.

Mr. McCoy: Ok continue.

Secretary: The nominators name is Gordon Burkland, the seconds name is Tom Grochala, and its been accepted. The next one is Clinton Lovett, the seconds name is Robert Pruitt, and its been accepted. Billy Lewis, the seconds name is Jimmy Davidson, and its been accepted. Alvin R. Young, the seconds name is J. M. Newman, and its been accepted. Robert Standley, the seconds name is Thomas Lager, and its been accepted. J. E. David for Rick Procise, and its been accepted. We have a third candidate for Delegate. The nominators name is Daniel Taylor, the candidates name is Alan Stouder, we have two seconds, Joseph Baldwin, and its been accepted and Brian C. Relitz and its been accepted. That is all we have as written nominations at this time.

Mr. McCoy: To make sure I understand what you are reading, we had nominations for J. E. David, R. L. Procise and Alan Stouder. Is that correct?

Secretary: Yes.

Mr. McCoy: We have a nomination of second and acceptance for these three individuals?

Secretary: Yes.

Mr. McCoy: The appropriate forms in the books have been filled out with the nominations and seconds and acceptances attached to these forms.

Secretary: Yes.

Mr. McCoy: Do we at this time have any nominations for the alternate delegates that has been mailed in to this office?

Secretary: No, we do not.

Mr. McCoy: At this time, all of the written correspondence relative to nominations, seconds and acceptances have been read into the record, we are now going to open the floor for further nominations for the position of delegate to the IBT convention. The way this will work is once we start, I will ask for nominations three separate times, if there is no nominations, nominations will be closed and we will move on to alternate delegate and follow the same procedure. So, at this particular time, the floor is open for nominations for delegate. Is there any nominations?

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T. R. Dadosky: Do I have to nominate Jack Procise? Or Jack David?

Mr. McCoy: No.

T. R. Dadosky: Can I nominate Alan Stouder for alternate?

Mr. McCoy: No, you can't run for delegate and alternate to. The way I understand the rules.

T. R. Dadosky: Ok.

Mr. McCoy: That was Mr. T. R. Dadosky who is in attendance at the meeting asking the question. Is there any other nominations? Any other nominations? Hearing none, the chair will close the nominations and will open the floor for nominations for alternate delegate. Is there any nominations for alternate delegate? Any other nominations for alternate delegate? Any other nominations for alternate delegate? Hearing none, the chair will close nominations for alternate delegate. I guess this will conclude the meeting for the nomination portion of it. Immediately following this, since there is no candidates present, I guess we will continue on with the lottery determining how they will appear on the ballot. Once that is done, advise the candidates of the date of the election and the counting of the ballots, in case they choose to be in attendance. The time is now 3:13 PM., this meeting is hereby officially closed.
